

Almost Home 2023


June 26th, Monday | Barton Hills Country Club

September | The Delonis Center



COVID-19 has also presented challenges for our community, with many struggling to access basic resources and maintain stable living situations.




Volunteer Here!



Eviction Filings Returning to Concerning Pre-Pandemic Rate

Support Winter Sheltering in Ypsi & A2

Right before all of us were upended by a global pandemic, many in our county were already experiencing a shift into an unknown reality – being evicted from their homes. Then COVID-19 happened. Staying safe from the pandemic for ourselves and others meant staying housed.

The rate of eviction filings in our state are once again on the rise and reaching pre-pandemic levels. Many have feared this rise in evictions as early back as when the state's eviction moratorium ended in 2021 and federal pandemic emergency rental assistance programs closed their application portals in 2022. By the end of 2022 hundreds of eviction cases were being handled through the courts without the significant amount of alternative funding needed and in place to help someone stay housed.

Highlights from Recent Fair Housing Training

On February 16th, the Washtenaw Housing Alliance and the Housing Coordinators Network presented a Fair Housing Training for Tenants and Housing Advocates. The training webinar was facilitated by the [Fair Housing Center of Southeast and Mid-Michigan](#) who explained that statements like the ones above are indeed false and fall under the Fair Housing Act as discrimination.

For those interested, the Fair Housing Center is hosting its Housing Advocates Training (HAT) on March 14th and March 21st. The HAT is a two-day training designed to help social service professionals and advocates gain a working knowledge of fair housing law, landlord/tenant law, and housing subsidy programs.
